

WASC Senior College and University Commission Statement on the Status of International Technological University

The commission commends ITU for:

It's continued emphasis on an industry and practitioner focused education model and its continuous adaptation in meeting changes in the Silicon Valley industry environment.

Engaged faculty and staff who are committed to ITU's mission, education and welfare of students and the inclusive participation of faculty , staff and students in the self-study.

On June 25, 2021, the WASC Senior College and University Commission (WSCUC) voted to continue the October 18, 2019 Order to Show Cause for the International Technological University (ITU) until October 2021. ITU remains accredited and the ITU students' status within the college is not affected by the continuation of the sanction.

The Order to Show Cause reflects the Commission's finding that an institution has serious issues of noncompliance with one or more of the Standards of Accreditation. The Commission has determined that ITU is not in compliance with WSCUC Standard 1 and Standard 3. Under WSCUC's policies, when the Commission finds that an institution fails to meet one or more of the Standards of Accreditation, it is required to notify the institution of these findings and give the institution no longer than two years from the date of the original sanction to correct the deficiencies. It is the responsibility of the Commission to determine, at the end of the sanction period, whether the institution has made the necessary corrections and has come into compliance with Commission Standards.

The Commission's decision to continue the Order to Show Cause is subject to the terms and conditions contained in the Commission Action Letter dated July 12, 2021.
